Note :

- ❖ The title should be descriptive ,effective , informative and simple.
- ❖ The title should be placed at the center.It should be no longer than 15 words.
- ❖ In title avoid abbreviations
- ❖ Font Style : Times New Roman , Font Size : 14
- ❖ It should not be bolded and underlined

Article Author

Note :

- ❖ Full name with First, Middle and Last name
- ❖ Institutional Affiliation
- ❖ Author and institutional affiliation should be double spaced

Abstract

Note :

- ❖ Abstract should be 300 words.
- ❖ Indent is not necessary on first line.
- ❖ Abstract should be quick overview , summary and important content of full paper
- ❖ Abstract should not include citation
- ❖ Abstract play a vital role in research paper which help reader to understand abstract make a judgment whether to keep reading or not

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Keyword

- ❖ Article should contain five to seven keywords.
- ❖ Keywords are not a part of the title

Introduction

- ❖ The introduction is a brief relevant summary of the research paper. It covers objective, overall issue, problem, or question that your research addresses, purpose of the research and its relation with other studies. Introduction describe short history or background that leads to a statement of the problem that is being addressed. Introduction should contain images , pictures which are useful to reader. Introduction should contain educated guesses about relationship.

Material & Methods

- ❖ Methods should be written in paragraph. The Methods section chronologically describes the process you undertook to complete the research. It should contain enough information to allow another scientist to repeat your experiment and get idea. The method should contain the complete process explanation, analytical techniques , techniques for tracking functional variables. Methods includes tables , graphs including title and visuals that are labeled and referenced in the text. Tables , figures should be numbered in arabic numerals in the order in which they are cited in the text. Visuals are large enough to read the units. Each visual does not extend across more than one page. Equations are spaced apart from the text. Methods should include proper consideration. In research we used human object , what problems we have faced and is there is any person are ready to participate. In case of animals what you have done to minimize pain. Methods should not contain results. In an research which materials such as equipment, apparatus and measuring instruments are used and quality of instrument

Result

- ❖ Results should be clearly presented. Tables and figures should only be included if required to fully understand and summarize research. All figures are labeled and referenced in the text prior to the figure. Figures and graphs should be included with explanation. Do not discuss results. Negative results should also be included in results which is beneficial in report. Important facts and objective observations that are unambiguously true belong in Results. Results describe the research not interpret.

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Discussion

- ❖ Discussion should provide interpretations and conclusions about your findings. It relates to the goals of the study that might have been expected from background information obtained in lectures, textbooks. Discussion interpret evaluate, analyze, explain the significance and implications of results. Discussion should contain limitations, major experimental constraints. Recommend areas for future study lack of correlation, negative results. Don't repeat what you've written in the Results section. If results are unexpected you have to provide explanation, any other way to interpret your results, any further research are necessary to answer the question. The aim of this section is the interpretation of the results and their relation to the existing knowledge.

References

- ❖ References should be numbered in the order they appear within the manuscript. In the text they should be referred to by numbers in square brackets. In the 'References section' items should be listed numerically in the order they are cited in the text, not alphabetically. All authors of the cited items should be included, regardless of the number. If DOI is available, DOI number must be included at the end of each reference. Personal communications, and unpublished data are not allowed. A minimum of 15 references are required.

In an in text citation we have to mention the last name of the author and year between parenthesis. In case of two authors, both should be mentioned. When there are three or more authors, mention only the first author followed by et al. When two or more references are cited in the same parenthesis, the authors should be in chronological order. And if they have the same year, they should be in alphabetical order. Moreover, if there is more than one reference of the same author and the same year, they should be indicated with letters.

References should be written :

Place each author's last name, then a comma, then the first initial of the given name, then any additional initials. A period should follow each initial. Separate the last author from the second-to-last author with a comma and ampersand (&). Separate any additional authors by commas. Followed by year of publication in parenthesis and end with a period. Then title of the article with each word capital. Title and subtitle are separated with colon. Title and subtitle are separated with colon. End the title with period. Then comma, volume number (issue number), first page-last page.

Eg.

Author, A. A., Author, B. B., & Author, C. C. (1996). Title of journal article. Title of journal: Subtitle of journal, volume number (issue number), first page-last page.
